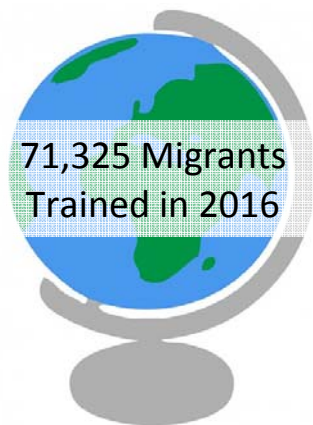

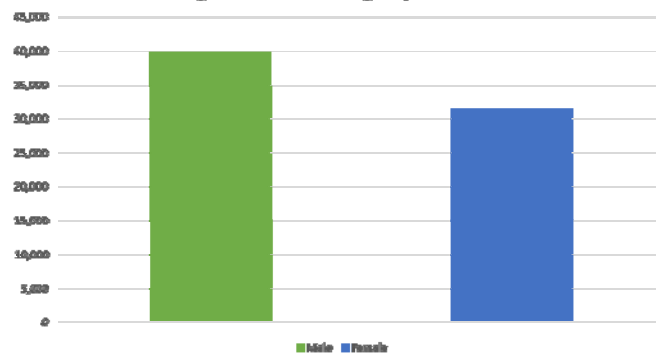

Migrant training took place in **70 countries** providing orientation to beneficiaries representing **92 nationalities**



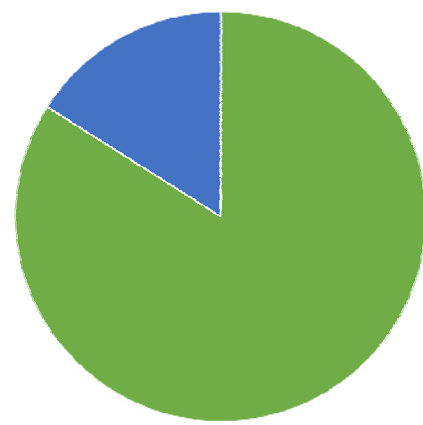
Migrant Training by Gender
